The fortunate collector who finds a meteorite has found a specimen that escaped its original orbit, with the speed, size and angle of entry necessary to cross Earth's orbit. The specimen then landed on terrestrial Earth in an area where it could attract the eye of the collector. Ms. Morrison answered questions from the audience.


